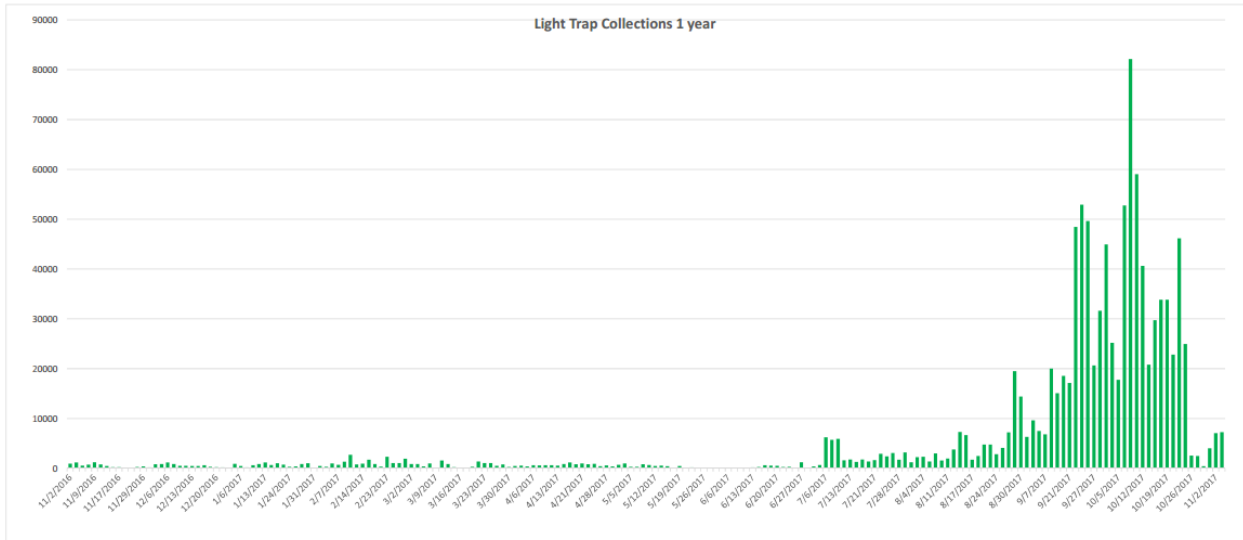
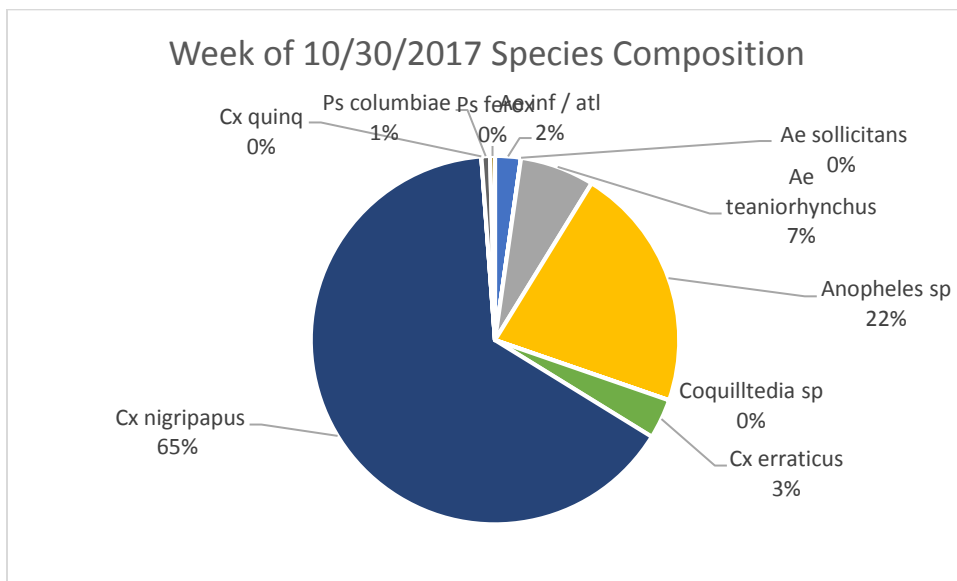


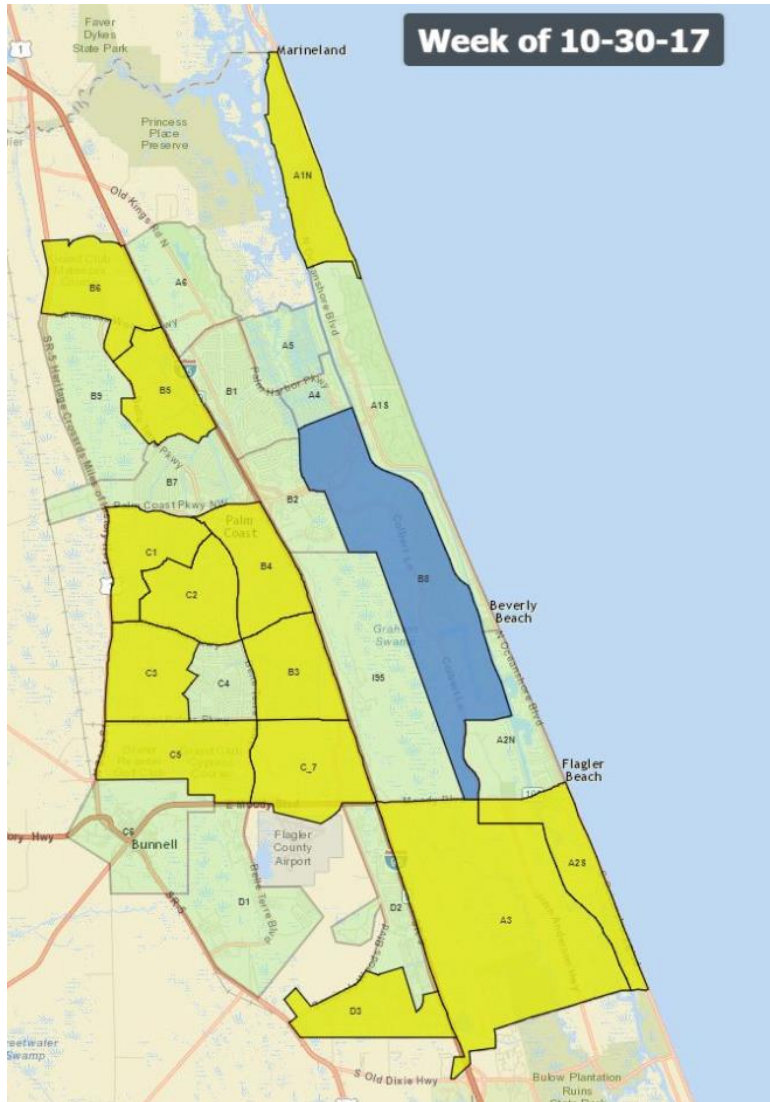
## Week of 10/30/2017 Operations Update

This week temperatures warmed considerably and there was a resultant mosquito activity rebound. Adulticiding operations resumed mid-week in what I would call, "limited spraying." Populations were not as high as they have been and, barring additional rainfall, should continue to decline.



From the graph below you can see most of the mosquitoes we are catching are *Culex* sp. and *Anopheles* sp. Our task now is to eliminate as much of the remaining flood water mosquitoes, mainly the "black salt marsh mosquito" (*Aedes taeniorhynchus*) as possible, and reduce the *Culex* and *Anopheles* populations to baseline numbers.





Next weekend is the Creekside festival so we will begin monitoring Princess Place on Sunday to determine if additional aerial spraying is required for the salt marsh mosquitoes.
